Season 2015

Welcome to the 2015 Season of the LCSO! With the achievement of this, our third season, our orchestra has become well established in the cultural life of the region – a testimony to the dedication of its musicians and the loyalty and enthusiasm of its audiences.

This year's concert program offers an array of works ranging from baroque to contemporary, from the familiar and well-loved to the completely new. The familiar music will bring pleasurable recognition and hopefully good memories to mind. By including hitherto unknown music, we hope to provide our audiences (and our musicians) with an ever-widening palette of well-loved composers and pieces.

Four pieces in our 2015 program made the recent **ABC FM Classic 100 Swoon Countdown**. If you missed the results of this popular listener's-choice competition, you might have a guess about which of the musical works on our program are Australia-wide favourites?

As to music completely unknown to our audiences, we are quite confident we have at least one piece in this category! A newly minted work by Beachport composer **Chris Waite**, titled "**Essay on Alchemy**" was completed in May this year and will have its world premiere in the 2015 season. "Essay on Alchemy" has been played with singular enjoyment by the orchestra during rehearsals. We hope that Limestone Coast audiences share our appreciation and pride in this talented local composer and the clever, tuneful music he writes.

In October 2014, the LCSO was presented with the community Arts Award in the Regional **BrandSA Awards** Ceremony. Such public recognition, in addition to enthusiastic audience response and happy musicians, are indicators that our orchestra is developing most satisfactorily.

The support of a number of community organizations remains crucial to the orchestra's success. These include The Mount Gambier City Band, Country Arts SA and the Mount Gambier City Council. The Mount Gambier City Band provides financial auspicing, a rehearsal home and use of their percussion instruments.

This support has happily existed with the evolving support of Country Arts SA and our status of **Orchestra in Residence** of the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre. This relationship promises exciting possibilities for expansion of the orchestra's presence in the theatre. Various practical issues, such as ownership of a permanent stock of percussion instruments are being actively pursued by the parties involved. This, we feel, is a goal worthy of the striving.

In the meantime, the LCSO management has been busy establishing an electronic home for the orchestra at www.lcso.org.au. This new website was proclaimed open earlier this week at the LCSO Season 2015 Launch. Developed with the assistance of the Stand Like Stone Foundation and local music philanthropist Margaret Bilney, the website will connect local, national and international viewers and enable players, Friends of the LCSO and Sponsors to more easily engage and communicate with the orchestra into its future.

CONDUCTOR ANGUS CHRISTIE

Angus Christie studied conducting at the Vienna Academy and the Kodaly Institute in Hungary. He was teacher of orchestral conducting at the University of Oslo and conductor of the University of Oslo Symphony Orchestra and the University of Bergen Symphony Orchestra for eight years.

Angus is currently the conductor of the Limestone Coast Symphony Orchestra, Principal Guest Conductor of the Warrnambool Symphony Orchestra and Conductor of both the Hamilton Symphony Orchestra and the newly formed Hamilton Strings.

MATT TOFFOLON Bassoon

From an early age, Matt demonstrated a keen interest in music and soon commenced studies on the Clarinet and composing his own works. However, it wasn't until late in high school that Matt was convinced by his teachers that his hands were oversized for the Clarinet and his long fingers would be better suited to the Bassoon - the rest is history. He completed studies with Richard McIntyre at the Australian National University School of Music in 2006, obtaining a Bachelor of Music in Performance with Honours. During this time, Matt gained extensive performance experience as an orchestral, chamber and solo musician. In addition, Matt also studied Composition and Conducting, being accepted into the prestigious Symphony Australia Young Conductors Program with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra in 2005. Matt moved from Sydney to Hamilton in 2011 with his wife Claire and is currently teaching Music and Drama at Hamilton and Alexandra College.

ELSPETH BAWDEN Soprano

Elspeth is 18 years old and is now in her second year of Classical Voice study at the Conservatorium of Music, University of Melbourne. She began singing lessons at the age of 9 and has been competing and performing throughout Victoria and South Australia ever since. Elspeth developed a passion for opera and musical theatre at a very young age and hopes to one day be a performer in these genres.

Elspeth has performed as Guest Soprano with both the Hamilton and Warrnambool Symphony Orchestras and has performed principal roles in Bye Bye Birdie, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat, Oklahoma, Fiddler on the Roof, Titanic, Godspell and Seussical.

She was a choreographer for Godspell, Cats and Seussical and has also produced, directed and choreographed school and community fundraising concerts. This is Elspeth's second appearance as a Guest Soloist with the LCSO.

Tameka started her musical journey playing flute, which she took with her to the Elder Conservatorium of Adelaide in 2003, completing a Certificate 3 in Music, before transitioning to the French horn. Once introduced to the French Horn, Tameka fell in love with the complexities and sound of this most versatile of instruments and never looked back.

In 2004 she was accepted into the Certificate 4 Classical Music program on the Horn and then completed a Bachelor of Music, Honours Degree in Brass Performance and a Graduate Diploma in Education.

Tameka has performed with local orchestras, bands, ensembles and theatre companies, including playing with the Adelaide Arts Orchestra and in productions including The Magic Flute (Co-Opera), The Secret Garden and My Fair Lady.

Tameka is currently a classroom music and brass instrumental teacher at Tenison Woods College and the current conductor of the SE Primary Schools Music Festival.

She also teaches privately and finds great fulfilment in watching the progress her students make along their instrumental journey.

CATHY FOSTER Soloist and Concertmaster

Cathy started learning violin at the age of thirteen at Millicent High School under the instruction of well-respected music teacher, Judy Cooper.

At age 17, she played in the SA Youth Orchestra and went on to complete a Bachelor of Music degree, specializing in performance on the violin. In the final year of her degree, she worked for a violin repairist, setting up new instruments and re-hairing bows.

She has played piano and violin for numerous local productions, including the memorable Ovation production of Chicago in 2011 with the Generations in Jazz students. Cathy also performs in a duo with local classical guitarist Mike Walsh.

Cathy has been teaching violin and piano privately since graduation. As an accomplished pianist, she supports young musicians at the Eisteddfod, AMEB examinations and Year 12 summative In her role as Concertmaster, Cathy conducts performances. additional sectional rehearsal sessions on a weekly basis through the pre-concert rehearsal period to prepare the hard-working string section players for performance.

CHRISTOPHER WAITE Composer

1970 -

Originally from Adelaide, Chris studied Music Performance at Norwood High School and in 1985 won the *SA Young Composers Award* with a work written for piano and 4 voices. After graduating from Flinders Medical School in 1994 he completed post-graduate studies in General Practice, and spent several years working for the Royal Flying Doctor Service in Central Australia. In 2007 he moved to Beachport, where he continued working as a GP until 2012.

Chris completed a Certificate 4 in Audio Engineering in 2002 and is currently studying a Bachelor of Creative Arts, majoring in music composition, at the University of Southern Queensland (USQ), Toowoomba, by distance education. In 2013 he resumed piano studies with Daniel Lynn in Mount Gambier.

Last year his Festive Overture was premiered by the Limestone Coast Symphony Orchestra, and in 2015 a new work, titled **Essay on Alchemy**, will be presented. Chris is greatly appreciative of the encouragement and support he has received preparing this work for performance and would like to personally thank: Dr Rhoderick McNeill (USQ), Angus Christie, and the Musicians of our Orchestra.

ESSAY ON ALCHEMY

Taking the form of a musical essay, the introduction presents us with a taste of the two main musical motifs used through the work, along with an underlying rhythmic pattern. Within the body of the work, each paragraph explores a theme in more detail, finishing with a conclusion that brings together each of these elements.

The first motif, partially presented by woodwinds at the beginning of the work, is heard in its entirety by the violas and French horn in duet, shortly after the introduction. Similarly, snippets of the second theme are introduced throughout the piece, but it is not presented completely until half way through the essay by the cellos and double basses.

From here, the first and second motifs play against each other, increasing in intensity, until the emergence of an ancient manta, the Prajñaparamita, which represents a class of Mahayana scriptures also known as the Perfection of Wisdom Sutras. The mantra disperses, bringing us back to the first theme, a short string fugato on the second theme, then carrying the essay to its concluding paragraph with full orchestral tutti.

Why write on alchemy? While I don't imagine that in two hundred bars of music I will convert base metals into gold or even discover a universal elixir; the reference to alchemy is representative of transformation; whether of musical motifs or otherwise. Along with wisdom to guide us this might make for an enlightening experience - whether in the theatre or elsewhere.

I look forward to sharing the premiere of *Essay on Alchemy* with you and all analysis aside; I trust most of all, that you will enjoy the work.
